The Plymouth County Board of Supervisors met to canvass the Remsen-Union Special Election held April 3, 2001. Present were Vice Chairman Vander Hamm, members Spies, Kestner and Sitzmann.

Upon the public measure **“Shall the Board of Directors of the Remsen-Union Community School District in the counties of Plymouth and Sioux be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$7,600,000 to provide funds to build and furnish new elementary and new middle school buildings, and to improve and acquire sites?”**

there were one thousand five hundred eighty-two (1582) votes cast, as follows:

FOR the question there were eight hundred sixty-nine (869) votes cast.

AGAINST the question there were seven hundred thirteen (713) votes cast.

We therefore declare the public measure not adopted.

Upon the public measure **“Shall the Board of Directors of the Remsen-Union Community School District in the counties of Plymouth and Sioux, be authorized to levy annually a tax exceeding two dollars and seventy cents per thousand dollars, but not exceeding four dollars and five cents per thousand dollars of the assessed value of the taxable property within said school corporation to pay the principal of and interest on bonded indebtedness of said school corporation approval of this proposition shall not limit the source of payment of the bonds and interests, but shall only operate to restrict the amount of bonds which may be issued?”**

there were one thousand five hundred eighty-one (1581) votes cast, as follows:

FOR the question there were eight hundred thirty-five (835) votes cast.

AGAINST the question there were seven hundred forty-six (746) votes cast.

We therefore declare the public measure not adopted.

Motion by Kestner, seconded by Spies, to approve the expense of \$1,334.70 and authorize the auditor to bill the Remsen-Union school.

The Board adjourned at 9:28 A.M.
