The Plymouth County Board of Supervisors met in adjourned session on October 16th to canvass the Remsen-Union Special Election held on October 9th. Present were Chairman Philips, members Sitzmann, Kestner, and Spies. Absent was Vander Hamm.

Following are the results:

Upon the public measure **“Shall the Board of Directors of the Remsen-Union Community School District in the Counties of Plymouth and Sioux, State of Iowa, be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$7,600,000 to provide funds to build and furnish new elementary and new middle school buildings, and to improve and acquire sites?”**

There were one thousand five hundred twenty-nine (1529) votes cast as follows:

FOR the question there were eight hundred forty-three (843) votes cast.

AGAINST the question there were six hundred eighty-six (686) votes cast.

We therefore declare the public measure “see above” to be not adopted.

Upon the public measure **“Shall the Board of Directors of the Remsen-Union Community School District in the counties of Plymouth and Sioux, State of Iowa, be authorized to levy annually a tax exceeding two dollars and seventy cents per thousand dollars, but not exceeding four dollars and five cents per thousand dollars of the assessed value of the taxable property within said school corporation to pay the principal of and interest on bonded indebtedness of said school corporation, approval of this proposition shall not limit the source of payment of the bonds and interest, but shall only operate to restrict the amount of bonds which may be issued:”**

There were one thousand five hundred twenty-two (1522) votes cast as follows:

FOR the question there were eight hundred thirteen (813) votes cast.

AGAINST the question there were seven hundred nine (709) votes cast.

We therefore declare the public measure “see above” to be not adopted.
