The Plymouth County Board of Supervisors met in adjourned session on October 28, 2003. All members were present. All votes are aye unless otherwise indicated.

Minutes of the October 21, 2003 meeting were read and approved.

Motion by Vander Hamm, seconded by Philips, to approve the canvass of the Kingsley Special Election on October 21st with the following results:

Upon the Public measure “*Shall the City of Kingsley, Iowa, issue its General Obligation Capital Loan Notes in an amount not exceeding the amount of \$350,000 for the purpose of building, equipping and furnishing a wellness center and a walking trail in conjunction with the Kingsley-Pierson Community School District?*”

There were four hundred eighty-nine (489) votes cast as follows:

FOR the question were two hundred seventy (270) votes cast.

AGAINST the question there were two hundred fourteen (214) votes cast.

Motion by Vander Hamm, seconded by Greene, to approve an application for construction on Co. Rd. ROW for Long Lines Limited on North side Hwy 30 to K-64, then North on West side to Hwy 3, then East side of K-64 to Sioux City line.

Motion by Philips, seconded by Spies, to approve an application for construction on Co. Rd. ROW for Long Lines Limited for buried 24 fiber optic communications cable in Sec. 30/31 America Township.

Motion by Spies, seconded by Greene, to approve an application for Long Lines Limited to cross state road ROW with approval by Plymouth County in Sec.30/31 America Township.

Motion carried.

Motion by Philips, seconded by Vander Hamm, to approve an application for construction on Co. Rd. ROW for Hickory Tech in Sec.15/22 Sioux Township.

Motion carried.

Motion by Spies, seconded by Philips, to approve a change order for Sabre Communications for +\$3,047 for the tower foundation.

Motion carried.

Motion by Philips, seconded by Vander Hamm, to move the Boardroom to the old Sheriff's Office in the Courthouse.
