Canvass of the June 8th Primary was done at 9:00 a.m. with the following results:

For the office of Board of Supervisor District 2-Republican, there were two thousand five hundred seventy-five votes cast as follows: John A. Schneider received one thousand three hundred forty-seven votes; David Vander Hamm received one thousand two hundred twenty six votes; scattering received two votes. We therefore declare John A. Schneider as the winner.

For the office of Board of Supervisor District 5-Republican, there were two thousand five hundred seventy-two votes cast as follows: Stephen L. Brown received four hundred ninety-six votes; Jim Henrich received nine hundred fifty-four votes; Merle Huls received three hundred ninety-three votes; Richard Philips received seven hundred twenty-nine votes. We therefore declare Jim Henrich as the winner.

For the office of Board of Supervisor District 5-Democratic, there were one hundred sixty-five votes cast as follows: Steven Welch received one hundred sixty-five votes.

For the office of County Auditor-Republican there were two thousand six hundred fifty-six votes cast as follows: K.Kae Meyer received one thousand six hundred sixty-one votes; Dan Ryan received nine hundred ninety-five votes. We therefore declare K.Kae Meyer as the winner.

For the office of County Sheriff-Republican, there were two thousand four hundred fifty-seven votes cast as follows: Mike Van Otterloo received two thousand four hundred forty-seven votes; scattering received ten votes.

For the office of United States Senator-Democratic, there were one hundred seventy-two votes cast as follows: Arthur Small received one hundred seventy-one; scattering received one.

For the office of United States Senator-Republican there were two thousand four hundred three votes cast as follows: Chuck Grassley received two thousand three hundred ninety-six votes; scattering received seven votes.

For the office of United States Representative District 5-Democratic, there were two hundred twenty votes cast as follows: Gene Blanshan received sixty-one votes; Sal Mohamed received thirty-nine votes; E.Joyce Schulte received one hundred nineteen votes; scattering received one. We therefore declare E. Joyce Schulte as the winner.

For the office of United States Representative District 5-Republican, there were two thousand two hundred seventy-seven votes cast as follows: Steve King received two thousand two hundred sixty-nine votes; scattering received eight.

For the office of State Representative District 53-Democratic, there were forty votes cast as follows: Dick Sokolowski received forty votes.

For the office of State Representative District 53-Republican, there were four hundred fifty-two votes cast as follows: Dan Huseman received four hundred fifty-two votes.

For the office of State Representative District 2-Republican, there were two thousand nine votes cast as follows: Dave Mulder received nine hundred ninety-eight votes; Kenneth Veenstra received one thousand nine votes; scattering received two votes. We therefore declare Kenneth Veenstra as the winner.

For the office of State Representative District 3-Republican, there were two thousand thirty-three votes cast as follows: Kent Schwiesow received eight hundred fifty votes; Chuck Soderberg received one thousand one hundred seventy-eight votes; scattering received five votes. We therefore declare Chuck Soderberg as the winner.
