The agenda for the March 28, 2006 meeting was approved after removing the agenda item #7 B. Authorize the county to borrow internally to finance the down payment for Kilkers Industrial Park 2nd Addition.

Minutes of the March 21, 2006 meeting were approved.

The Board discussed the Mid American Energy audit for the courthouse.

Motion by Greene, seconded by Henrich, to approve Larry Hoffman to get 2 bids for the courthouse energy audit updates. Motion Carried.

Motion by Henrich, seconded by Schneider, to set April 18th at 10:30 a.m. as the date for the 2005-2006 budget amendment hearing. Motion Carried.

Linda Dobson, Plymouth County Treasurer presented the Treasurer's report from the Spring ISAC meeting.

The public hearing on zoning ordinance and map changes was opened at 1:02 p.m. Several members from the public were present. Zoning ordinance and map changes were presented by Melvin Brown and Riley Simpson. Dennis Sohl, Plymouth County Conservation Director voiced his concern that this plan should protect land in the Loess Hills from being leveled due to the development of homes or any other type of development. Currently this plan does not have regulations to prevent this; however the zoning plan can be modified anytime should this situation occur.
