

September 11, 2009

The Plymouth County Board of Supervisors met in the Boardroom on September 11, 2009 at 8:30 a.m. All members were present, except Jim Henrich. All votes following are aye unless otherwise indicated.

Motion by Anderson, seconded by Loutsch, to approve the September 11th, 2009 agenda. Motion Carried.

Motion by Kass, seconded by Anderson, to approve the canvass the 2009 School Board Election as presented:

AKRON-WESTFIELD

For the office of Director District 1 there were twenty-one (21) votes cast as follows: Kevin DeRocher received ten (10) votes; scattering received eleven (11) votes. We therefore declare Kevin DeRocher duly elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 2 there were sixty-four (64) votes cast as follows: Phil Parks received sixty-three (63) votes; scattering received one (1) vote. We therefore declare Phil Parks duly elected for the office of Director District 2 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 3 there were sixty-two (62) votes cast as follows: Josh Martinsen received sixty-one votes (61); scattering received one (1) vote. We therefore declare Josh Martinsen duly elected for the office of Director District 3 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 5 – to fill a vacancy – there were nineteen (19) votes cast as follows: Janet Willer received six (6) votes; scattering received thirteen (13) votes. We therefore declare Janet Willer duly elected for the office of Director District 5 – to fill a vacancy- for the term of 2 years.

HINTON COMMUNITY

For the office of Director At Large there were one thousand three hundred nineteen (1319) votes cast as follows: Robert D. Held received five hundred thirty-five (535) votes; John W. Reintzel received three hundred eighty-six (386) votes; Brett Stanley received three hundred fifty-five (355) votes; scattering received forty-three (43) votes. We therefore declare Robert D. Held duly elected for the office of Director At Large for the term of 4 years and John W. Reintzel duly elected for the office of Director At Large for the term of 4 years.

BOND ISSUE

Upon public measure “ Shall the Board of Directors of the Hinton Community School District in the County of Plymouth, State of Iowa be authorized to contract indebtedness and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$5,900,000 to provide funds to construct, build, furnish and equip an elementary building and improve the site?”

There were eight hundred thirty-six (836) votes cast as follows:

FOR the question, there were five hundred forty-five (545) votes.

AGAINST the question, there were two hundred ninety-one (291) votes.

We therefore declare the public measure to be adopted.

KINGSLEY-PIERSON

For the office of Director District 1 there were forty-four (44) votes cast as follows: Shari Seuntjens received forty-four (44) votes. We therefore declare Shari Seuntjens duly elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 3 there were forty-seven (47) votes cast as follows: Scott Bohle received forty-seven (47) votes. We therefore declare Scott Bohle duly elected for the office of Director District 3 for the term of 4 years.

LEMARS COMMUNITY

For the office of Director District 1 there were one hundred fifty-two (152) votes cast as follows: Scott Kommes received one hundred fifty-two (152) votes. We therefore declare Scott Kommes duly elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 4 there were one hundred forty-five (145) votes cast as follows: Brenda Phelan received one hundred forty-five (145) votes. We therefore declare Brenda Phelan duly elected for the office of Director District 4 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 2 there were one hundred forty-eight (148) votes cast as follows: Cris Collins received one hundred forty-eight (148) votes. We therefore declare Cris Collins elected for the office of Director District 2 for the term of 4 years.

REMSEN-UNION

For the office of Director District 1 there were forty-five (45) votes cast as follows: Michael E. Sparr received twenty (20) votes; Travis J. Tentinger received twenty-five (25) votes. We therefore declare Travis J. Tentinger duly elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 3 there were twenty-six (26) votes cast as follows: Cheri A. Nitzschke received twenty (20) votes; scattering received six (6) votes. We therefore declare Cheri A. Nitzschke duly elected for the office of Director District 3 for the term of 4 years.

For the office of Director District 5 there were thirty-three (33) votes cast as follows: David Bortscheller received five (5) votes; Theresa Van Dam received twenty-seven (27) votes; scattering received one (1) vote. We therefore declare Theresa Van Dam duly elected for the office of Director District 5 for the term of 4 years.

WESTERN IOWA TECH COMMUNITY COLLEGE

For the office of Director District 1 there were two hundred forty-nine (249) votes cast as follows: Neal Adler received two hundred forty-one (241) votes; scattering received eight (8) votes.

For the office of Director District 8 there were forty (40) votes cast as follows: Russell C. Wray received forty (40) votes.
