

November 16, 2010
Le Mars, Iowa

The Plymouth County Board of Supervisors met in the Boardroom on November 16, 2010 at 9:30 a.m. All members were present. All votes following are aye unless otherwise indicated.

Motion by Anderson, seconded by Kass, to approve the agenda for November 16, 2010. Motion Carried.

Motion by Anderson, seconded by Loutsch, to approve the November 9, 2010 minutes. Motion Carried.

Jolynn Goodchild, Plymouth County Recorder introduced Kerri Ludwigs as the new Recorder's office clerk with a start date of November 15, 2010.

The Board of Supervisors reviewed the IJOBS grant agreement to receive \$85,000 for the storm shelter in the Plymouth County Courthouse Annex building and will approve November 30th after contacting IJOBS regarding agreement concerns.

The Board of Supervisors agreed to not have two representatives on the Compensation Board this year, as Don Konopasek is not able to serve at the December 10th, 2010 compensation board meeting.

Motion by Greene to give a 5 year \$50,000 loan from the Local Option Sales tax fund from Fiscal Year 2011-12 budget with 1.23% interest to the movie theatre in Le Mars. Motion dies for lack of a second.

Motion by Anderson, seconded by Kass, to deny the \$50,000 request from the LBIC for a grant or loan to the movie theatre in Le Mars. Anderson-aye; Kass-aye; Henrich-aye; Loutsch-aye; Greene-nay. Motion Carried.

Mike Porter of Plymouth Life, Mark Kunkel and Cheri Nitzschke from the public were present to discuss the need to provide more safety precautions on Highway 3 near Plymouth Life after the fatality of a Plymouth Life resident occurred. Mike Porter contacted the mail service and has moved the mail box to the Plymouth Life building and off of the highway. Other suggestions were to install a fence around Plymouth Life, cutting down a tree to open up sight to Highway 3, contact the City of Le Mars to replace lights that are out and to add additional lighting along the highway, ask the City of Le Mars to install a sidewalk along the south side of Highway 3, and to seek the proper means to reduce the speed limit along the highway. The County will contact the DOT, along with the City of Le Mars, to support reducing the speed limit and Mike Porter will contact the City of Le Mars about improving lighting and installing a sidewalk.

Motion by Anderson, seconded by Kass, to approve the repair of a bridge on Otter Ave. with local tax dollars vs. closing it or constructing a gravel road by-pass at this time. Motion Carried.

Motion by Loutsch, seconded by Kass, to approve the crop land lease at Chatsworth Pit. Motion Carried.

Motion by Loutsch, seconded by Kass, to approve the 2010 family farm allows and disallows. Motion Carried.
